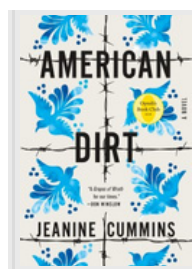


HOUSE OF EARTH AND BLOOD by Sarah J. Maas

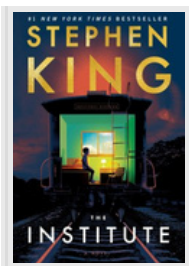


AMERICAN DIRT by Jeanine Cummins

And outside his door are other doors, behind which are other kids with special talents—telekinesis and telepathy—who got to this place the same way Luke did. "You check in, but you don't check out."

Oh, Coriolanus Snow...I was hoping and hoping that somehow he wouldn't REALLY end up horrible, but he did!! :(- Alison

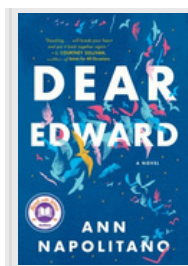


THE BOOK WOMEN OF TROUBLESOME CREEK

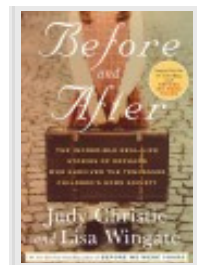


EDUCATED: A MEMOIR

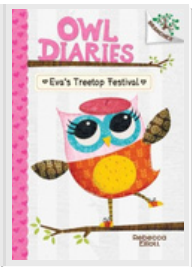
THE UNTEACHABLES

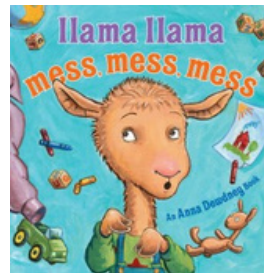

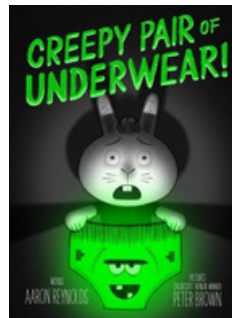

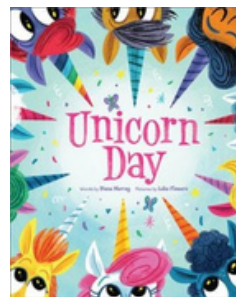
